Term 1 Holiday Program

Every school holiday Aim High Education Centre runs holiday programs for students with special needs. Indoor activities are on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays. Outdoor activities (field trips) are on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

During indoor activities, we provide variety of activities including game-based activities, gym exercises, puzzles and board games, art and craftwork, reading and writing. We also offer a fun baking class or a candle making class.

There are various educational materials in the centre so our students can learn and explore using them. At PE class our teachers encourage the students to join our jump jam and dance time.

From 11th April to 21st April in term 1 school holiday, 15 students and young adults participated Aim High Education Centre holiday programmes. Two new students joined our current students.

For field trips we visited fun places including Auckland Zoo, Tree Adventures, Rainbows End and Motat. Every school holidays College students and adult volunteers come help us to take care of our participants. Our students explore outdoor activities with 1:1 supervision.



Aim High Centre at three years old, Aim High Cafe at two years old. The two are both growing up as they face various troubles along the way. We started from nothing and have made mistakes and struggled 24/7, but we are overcoming them each day with the help of close, loving neighbours. The education centre and cafe were opened in the hope that people with disabilities could spend time together in a happy and enjoyable manner. During this journey, we have met many good people and are grateful for many things we have received, but on the other hand, we are still in need of greater attention.

We went on boats, trees, buses, trains, and horses, hoping to enrich the lives of our disabled friends. In New Zealand, disability welfare is a cradle-to-grave policy, but it does not include 100% of the education, training, and care that people with disabilities need. The policy provides minimal support for people with disabilities, and Aim High was started to go beyond that and make each person's life more enjoyable and enriching. Step by step, we are planning and progressing with Trustee Donghyun Kim, Trustee Youngmi Park, and Operator Jung-ho. All the staff at the centre and the cafe are working hard and serving to keep Aim High at its best every day.

During my brief visit to South Korea earlier this year, I had the chance to visit several employment centres for people with disabilities. This was when I came to the realization that Aim High could not be a self-supporting organization. Successful employment centres in Korea had over 300 people with disabilities and over 100 non-disabled employees to operate while receiving sponsorship and volunteer help. The jobs of people with disabilities are less efficient and productive, and this is inevitable. Therefore, without sponsorship and help from people and the government, it is unlikely for the organization to succeed. In situations where support is assured, employment and a high quality of life for people with disabilities can be guaranteed.

We are aiming for at least 10 years from now. At the pace that is for us, for the disabled. The day will come when our sincere efforts will bear fruit. We are grateful to those who come from far away just to have coffee with us for the people of Aim High. Also, to those who make monthly donations and to those who stand by with a big smile while our people serve coffee as they dance to their excitement, Additionally, to those who give up their holidays to come and help us support the activities of the disabled, we show our greatest gratitude. Thank you, and we will constantly aim higher for our people.


